# 2020 COLLEGE SENIOR SURVEY (CSS)

Each year thousands of students across the United States complete the College Senior Survey, a national survey from the Higher Education Research Institute (HERI) at UCLA. The CSS was administered Spring 2020 when most students were participating in online learning. The results in this newsletter profile Chapman University's graduating class of 2020. Over 216 graduating seniors completed the survey online resulting in a 12% response rate.

#### **ACTIVITIES DURING COLLEGE**

**73.6%** Participated in an internship program

71.9% Had a roommate of a different race/ethnicity

62.7% Held a leadership position in an organization

38.4% Joined a fraternity or sorority
35.0% Attended a racial/cultural awareness workshop

32.6% Participated in study abroad

25.0% Participated in an undergraduate research program





#### **FACULTY-STUDENT INTERACTION**

Percent reporting professors "Frequently" (on a 3-pt scale) provided them with:

**64.6%** Encouragement to ask questions and participate in discussions

Encouragement to discuss coursework outside of class

Encouragement to pursue graduate/professional study

Feedback on academic work (outside of grades) 50.8%

47.5% Advice and guidance about educational programs

**44.6%** Help in achieving professional goals

53.6% Felt overwhelmed by all I had to do

48.6% Felt anxious

24.2% Felt depressed

16.0% Sought personal counseling

**5.5%** Contributed money to help support my family

4.4% Felt hungry but didn't eat because I didn't have enough money for food

1.0% Missed class due to employment

Since entering college:

13.5% Held a full-time job while taking classes

2.3% Been homeless for at least one month



#### LIFE AFTER COLLEGE

66% Plan to work full-time after graduation

83.6% Chapman prepared me for employment (Percent reporting "Agree" or "Strongly Agree" on a 4-pt scale)

32% Plan to attend graduate school full-time after graduation

88.3% Chapman prepared me for graduate or advanced education (Percent reporting "Agree" or "Strongly Agree" on a 4-pt scale)

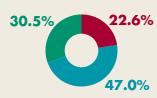

#### CAREER GOALS

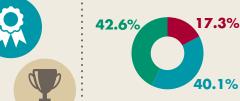
Percent reporting "Very Important" or "Essential" on a 4-pt scale

How often did professors provide you with an **opportunity to present** research findings or exhibit a creative work (e.g., an original piece of film, dance, music, creative writing, or other)?

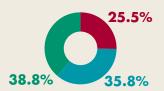
**ALUMNI ENGAGEMENT**
