## RESEARCH AND TEACHING OVERVIEW

My program of research investigates how social and biological factors shape body image dissatisfaction, health behaviors, sexuality, infidelity, mate preferences, and attitudes towards weight and obesity-related public policies. This work investigates how these experiences differ for gay, lesbian, bisexual, and heterosexual men and women, and for ethnic minority and majority men and women. To examine these phenomena, I conduct and analyze experiments, large-scale national surveys, and cross-cultural research surveys. My goal as a professor is to help students think like scientists and apply the theories they learn to understand their experiences, current events, and human behavior. I have over 60 lecture, seminar, and online courses, primarily in Research Methods (with labs), Human Sexuality, Psychology of Gender and Sexual Orientation, Social Psychology, Psychology of Gender and the Body, Social Psychology Research Lab Methods, Evolutionary Psychology, and Introductory Psychology. I supervise undergraduate and graduate research projects.

## SELECTED EXAMPLES OF MEDIA COVERAGE

Below are selected examples of news coverage of my research or commentary solicited for stories based on my research expertise, designed to help foster public interest in scientific research. ## **University Service**

Psychology Part-Time Faculty Coordinator, 2012-present. Approximately half of the courses in the department are taught by adjuncts and each semester approximately 20-25 part-time faculty are needed to teach these courses. In Spring 2021, 36 course sections were taught by part-time faculty. The average teaching evaluation for these faculty was 4.3/5.0 and median was 4.4/5.0. In Spring 2018, 37 course sections were taught by part-time faculty. The average teaching evaluation for these faculty was 4.3/5.0. Overseeing these faculty and responsibilities is a substantial time commitment but one that is very rewarding as I see faculty developing their teaching skills.

My service role is to recruit, interview, and recommend for hiring adjunct faculty to teach courses in Psychology. I then provide training, guidance, and feedback to adjunct professors. I conduct classroom observations of the faculty members and solicit feedback from students about their perceptions of the positives and negatives of the class in a structured format. I then provide detailed feedback to the faculty with concrete suggestions and examples to enable them to improve their lectures, exams, study guides, syllabi, and interactions with students in the classroom. For new faculty, I also provide detailed feedback on their syllabi to help them improve their assignments, course structure, and reading assignments, while still ensuring they maintain the academic freedom to highlight and showcase their expertise.

Furthermore, I address personnel issues that arise with adjunct faculty and students in consultation with the Department chair. In conjunction with the department chair and psychology department administrator, I create the course schedules and assignments after the full-time faculty have been assigned by the chair. I work with the psychology department administrator to solve the Rubik's cubic of scheduling adjuncts into timeslots and courses that are consistent with their availability and ensure that classes needed for majors and minors are being filled. I carefully track how many classes are filling, overfilling, or underfilling, and adjust course offerings to ensure that the needed classes are scheduled. A recent analysis of course enrollments university wide provided by Associate Provost of Academic Administration Dr. Ken Murphy on 5/16/2017 shows that the psychology department is nearly perfect in scheduling the appropriate number of seats and courses to meet the expected demand.

A major contribution I made to the department and to the university in this role is that I expanded course offering to so that psychology classes now routinely offered by top adjunct faculty during Interterm and Summer sessions. When I took over as adjunct coordinator, no faculty were teaching over interterm. I have expanded the Interterm teaching substantially to enable students greater flexibility in their course scheduling and to help us retain some of our top adjunct faculty by providing additional opportunity for income. Prior to my taking over scheduling, there were 0 classes over Interterm in 2012. I have steadily increased the number of sections offered since then as it appears there is currently an insatiable thirst for psychology classes over Interterm. In 2015, I scheduled 8 Interterm classes, and then increased this to 13 in 2016 and 12 in 2017. Approximately 571 students were able to enroll in psychology classes during Interterm, which may have contributed to the ability of the psychology department to routinely schedule classes with fewer than 25 students per class this year.

Finally, to recognize the exceptional performance of the adjunct faculty and because we face the problem that our best adjuncts get offered full-time positions or higher paying adjunct positions at nearby universities, I successfully petitioned the administration for pay raises for high performing adjuncts. Relatedly, the psychology department was awarded two year-long 3-2 part-time faculty positions but for 2017-2018 one of these positions was rescinded. I petitioned to retain both positions, showing that we are using these positions for very high-performing instructors who teach challenging classes and yet still maintain student teaching evaluations near 5.0 and reasonable course GPA distributions.
